Gary, Indiana-Mayor Karen Freeman-Wilson, the Gary Common Council and the City of Gary will host the Annual Harvest Festival for children on Wednesday, October 31, 2018 at the Hudson-Campbell Fitness Center; parking lot from 5:00 p.m.-7:30 p.m. The Hudson-Campbell is located at 455 Massachusetts Street.

This year's Harvest Festival and Trunk and Treat will feature for the first time, a special entertainment segment beginning at 6:00 p.m., produced by "Mother Divas House", a social media television series. "The Monternez Rezell Movement Revolution Dance Crew" will perform the Thriller Dance featuring an African Tribal House Music Remix Version of Thriller. "Thriller Dance 2300" is celebrating the 40th Anniversary of the release of "The Wiz" (October 24, 1978) and 35 years of Michael Jackson Thriller Video (Debut December 2, 1983 on MTV).
